

Quickspace Supersport, described as "the psychotic younger brothers of Stereolab", touch down on Sat 9th November. Quickspace's press release states the band sound like a carnival joy ride through repetitive hypnogrooves, exotic melodia and freaky psychedelia. They were formed in early 1995 by frontman Tom Cullinan following the demise of his previous band Th' Faith Healers, and have gone on to chalk up "Singles of the Week" in both the NME and Melody Maker with both "Superplus" and "Found a Way". Live they live up to all they promise on vinyl. "That trance-guitar loops ionising the air certainly sounds like Quickspace Happysong. The boy-girl vocals, the energising squiggles around the edges, the groovy warmth. And that's definitely Superplus, a Stereolab-tastic 7 inches of joy". NME FEB 24" 1966.

Formula One return to the Adelphi for the last time this year, after a sell-out gig last month. The gig will preview their debut vinyl offering, which is released on November 18th - a split single on Kooky with members of Prolapse on the other side. They've just recorded their first single proper for FIERCE PANDA (who in the past have released early singles by The Bluetones, Ash, Supergrass, Tiger & Gorky's among others) which is out in December. Comparisons have included Stereolab, Boo Radleys & Sonic Youth.
