

REPORT



Summary of Annual Meeting

The Fifty-third Annual Meeting of the Shepherd Street Mission was held in the Town Hall, Preston, on Thursday, October 24th, 1929, at three o'clock.

The Chair was taken by The Right Worshipful the Mayor of Preston (Councillor W. Lucas).

Rev. P. Addison Devis offered prayer.

The Chairman of the Mission (Mr. W. A. Margerison) gave a summary of the Report, and an abstract of the Financial Statement was given by the Hon. Treasurer (Mr. H. Southworth, F.C.A.).

It was then proposed by the Rev. P. Addison Devis, and seconded by the Rev. N. H. Fogg, B.A., and resolved: "That the Report, together with the Financial Statement, be adopted, printed and circulated under the direction of the Committee."

It was also resolved that the existing Committee, and Honorary Officials be re-elected *en bloc*, with the exception of Mr. Walter Davies, retired, and in whose place Mr. Rd. Hornby was unanimously elected as Hon. Auditor, and that Mr. Thos. Kittson be elected a member of the Committee.

A vote of thanks to the Mayor for presiding, and for the use of the Council Chamber, and to the Mayoress, also the Speakers, was proposed by Mr. R. Gregson, and seconded by Mr. J. Dixon.

54th Annual Report, 1930

I have great pleasure in presenting to you the Committee's Report.

Again we wish to express sincere thanks to our many friends who have so kindly given us such financial support and continued help during the year, as to enable us to carry on the ever-increasing work of our Home and Mission with a minimum of anxiety. From our Hon. Treasurer you will have an opportunity of hearing the Financial Statement.

It is with regret we have to record the death of our Superintendent and Secretary, Mr. Frank Ernest Chadwick, which took place on May 24 last at Preston Royal Infirmary. During the short two years Mr. Chadwick was with us the work benefitted by various improvements, and received a definite and distinct impetus. We have lost a very capable leader, and a good and valued father, and his influence remains in the lives of those he sought to help. To his widow, Mrs. Chadwick, we extend our condolence.

Consequent upon Mr. Chadwick's demise, Mrs. Chadwick has been appointed Matron of the Children's Home, and Mr. Slater, our Assistant Secretary, has been appointed to the dual position of Secretary and Missioner.

Our Committee has been further strengthened by the inclusion of Mr. Charles Plant.

The health of our large family has been exceptionally good, and with the exception of a few cases of measles, which we were able to isolate, and occasional instances of colds, we have been free from sickness. In his usual responsive and kindly way, our Hon. Physician, Dr. C. Stanwell, has dealt promptly and efficiently with cases needing medical attention, and we tender to Dr. Stanwell our grateful thanks.

During the year we have admitted nine children, six have been consigned to the care of relatives, three boys placed on farms, and two girls put to domestic service, leaving us at the time of making this Report with 50 children in the Home, which is thus taxed to its utmost capacity.

We are much indebted to the Headmaster, Staff and Boys of the Preston Grammar School for their very active interest in our work, and their untiring and unfailing efforts towards brightening the lives of the children in our care. Once again they have provided the Children's Christmas Dinner, decorated the Christmas Tree and Mission Hall, given toys and books, and entertained the staff and children to tea at the Grammar School, which was followed by a Concert thoroughly enjoyed, in addition to which they have also provided spending money for the whole family whilst on holiday at Fleetwood.

As in previous years, on Christmas morning I had the pleasure of taking part, along with our Mission workers, in the usual distribution of Breakfasts to over 1,200 of the poorest children in the town. The occasion was, however, made even more enjoyable by the presence of the Mayor and Mayoress (Councillor W. and Mrs. Lucas), who arrived a few minutes before eight o'clock and found everything in readiness for the Mayor to open the doors promptly on the stroke of the hour. In addition to a substantial breakfast, each child received the gift of a toy, 1,000 of which were very kindly provided by the Mayor. After the youngsters were satisfied at the Mission Hall, I visited the Home, and found great excitement, for Father Christmas had called there also and had not forgotten even one of the family, numbering just over 50. In the evening the children were taken down to the Mission Hall, where the festivities were continued; the room being beautifully decorated, and a fine Christmas Tree stood in the centre laden with good things, and Father Christmas called again, this time being actually seen, thanks to Mr. Cyril Wilson. And so ended a wonderful day, everyone tired, but happy.

NEW YEAR'S TREAT.

The usual New Year's Treat was held in the Mission Hall on Saturday, January 4th, to all our Sunday School scholars, teachers and the Mothers' Class. After tea various kinds of games for young and old were played, and later in the evening prizes for consistent attendance at Sunday School were kindly presented by Alderman Dr. Derham, who spoke of the good work going forward in such a needy locality.

WHITSUNTIDE OUTING.

On the 17th May we had our Annual Whitsuntide Treat, and by unanimous request Cleveleys was again visited. Unfortunately, the weather was wet, but, notwithstanding, everyone seemed to enjoy the trip. A splendid tea was provided at the Savoy Cafe, and later, in between showers, sports and games took place on the beach, prizes being presented by the Matron (Mrs. S. Chadwick). We are indebted to Messrs. Bell and Molyneaux, Mr. R. Bailey, and Messrs. Beech's for the provision of sweets, etc., which made an important contribution to the pleasure of the children.

WOMEN'S MEETING.

Women's meetings are held every Monday afternoon in our Mission Hall, under the leadership of Mrs. A. Spencer and Miss Petty, when addresses and solos are given by ladies invited from various churches and chapels in the town. The success attending these meetings has been occasioned by the Committee providing light refreshments. The Sunday afternoon mothers' class conducted by Mrs. Rossall is meeting a much felt want.

JUMBLE SALES.

Jumble Sales were held as usual in November and May, and realised the sum of £55 6s. 8d.

TOWN AND DISTRICT COLLECTORS.

We again tender our most hearty thanks to our many collectors and friends who subscribed to our annual House-to-house Collection the magnificent sum of $£231\ 10s.\ 2d.$

HOME CHILDREN'S HOLIDAY.

Through the kindness of Captain Bailey, The Cliffs, Little Bispham, we were again allowed the privilege of making Osborne House, Fleetwood, our Holiday Home for the children's summer vacation. Osborne House is prominently situated opposite the Pier, and overlooking the beach, and very convenient in every way for our requirements. Though the weather was unsettled almost throughout the whole holiday period, the children had a splendid time, and without exception returned with faces showing the benefit they had received. Both visitors and residents took a kindly interest in the children's welfare, and together with the generous help from the Headmaster, Staff and Boys of Preston Grammar School, contributed towards the numerous extra pleasures they were able to enjoy. Our thanks are also due to the Rev. Forbes Wilde, Rector of St. Paul's Evangelical Church, for his interest and help; and to Messrs. Melling, Billsborrow, Bailey and Jenkins for the gift of fish. Thus once more we are indebted to Captain Bailey for Osborne House, and we tender to him our hearty thanks.

WOMEN'S MEETING OUTING.

On July 8th an outing to Southport by saloon 'bus was given to the members of the Women's Meeting (held on Monday afternoons in the Mission Hall) over 60 being present. The drive was given by Mr. and Mrs. A. Spencer, and tea provided by the Committee. An enjoyable afternoon was spent, and a little sunshine brought into the lives of these poor women.

MISSION HALL.

Gospel Services are held every Sunday in our Mission Hall; for children at 10-30 a.m. and 6 p.m.; and for adults at 7 p.m. These Services are in charge of our Missioner (Mr. Thomas A. Slater) assisted by our own workers, and from time to time we have invited speakers from various churches and chapels in the town. Short meetings are also held in lodging-houses and on the streets around the Mission. Bible classes are held every Wednesday evening, and at other suitable times meetings for the deepening of the Spiritual life. During the winter, Saturday evenings have been devoted more particularly to the entertainment of the children and young people who throng this congested area.

HARVEST AND ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS.

As usual, we held our annual Harvest Festival in October last, and were fortunate in securing as our preacher for both Saturday night and Sunday the Rev. Edward H. Steele, Rector of St. Paul's Evangelical Church, Fleetwood. At each service we had crowded congregations. A fruit banquet followed on the Monday, and parcels of fruit and vegetables were distributed amongst the sick and needy. On June 22nd we had our Anniversary Services, the Rev. J. Gomer Williams, of Lancaster Road Congregational Church, taking the Children's Service in the afternoon, and Councillor Hocking (Leyland) addressed the evening meeting, both with much acceptance.

SUNDAY SCHOOL.

We are greatly cheered by the work going on in our Sunday School, and our grateful thanks are due to the splendid staff of teachers and helpers who so kindly and devotedly give of their time and thought to this very important work of teaching and training the young; a work so necessary in this age, for, as we are frequently reminded, "our children of to-day are the citizens of to-morrow." A number of our scholars sat for the Scripture Examination held under the auspices of the Preston and District Sunday School Union, and 11 were awarded certificates, one being with Honours and the 2nd prize in the Division. During the summer months the teachers have from time to time taken their classes for Saturday afternoon rambles in the country. On Sunday, September 21st, we took part in the Robert Raikes Third Jubilee Celebrations on Avenham Park—a never-to-be-forgotten occasion, 175 scholars and teachers taking part.

GARDEN PARTY.

On Saturday, 21st June, we held our second annual Garden Party, organised by the ladies of the Committee and the Matron (Mrs. S. Chadwick), ably assisted by the Mission workers. Despite a wet afternoon, the effort was again a success Mr. Levi Collison occupied the chair, and the Fete was opened by Mrs. Arthur Toulmin. The Chairman of the Mission (W. A. Margerison, Esq.) escorted the visitors round the Home, and all expressed their satisfaction at the conveniences and comforts provided for the children. Teas and light refreshments were served, and the Preston Town Silver Band, to whose members we are indebted, rendered a good variety of selections. To our Mission workers, and to all who helped, we tender our best thanks. We made a profit of £13.

LADS' CLUB.

By common consent it has been recognised that something should be undertaken for the type of youth who wanders aimlessly about the streets for want of something that would capture his interest and enthusiasm, and at the same time be the means of diverting his energy along lines constructive to good citizenship, rather than to the contrary. In an attempt to supply that need, which is acute in our Mission area, we have, in conjunction with "Toc H," formed a Lads' Club for youths 13 to 18 years of age. Club nights are held twice weekly, and are in charge of some of our competent male Mission members and a group of young men from "Toc H," to which organisation we are indebted for the loan of several articles of equipment. We hope that this new effort will be a success.
